


Global Stocktake – Mitigation Actions

Suggested key actions to be included in the outputs of the Global Stocktake

The Global Stocktake, which will be completed during the climate change conference in Dubai in December 2023, plays a key role in catalysing enhanced climate action and support. In the area of mitigation, the outputs of the Global Stocktake should include specific actions, which should be supported by targets.

Typical impacts of these mitigation actions, which go beyond climate change mitigation



Climate change mitigation measures that mainly address the supply side

	Boost wind and solar electricity supply	
	Phase out fossil fuels	
	Decarbonize industrial production

Climate change mitigation measures that mainly address the demand side

	Increase energy efficiency and sufficiency	
	Phase out fossil fuel subsidies while enabling a just transition	
	Electrify the vehicle fleet and facilitate a shift in transportation modes	
	Improve efficiency and shift towards renewable energy in the buildings sector

	Reduce methane emissions from fossil fuels, agriculture and waste	
	Stop deforestation and maximise removals on land
