



Objectives

Reduce the content of (severely) hazardous substances in materials and products, including recycled materials

Push for **substitution** of substances of concern and **prevention** of waste generation containing those substances




Contribute to a more **circular** economy: improve waste treatment operations



Increase authorities' **information** basis on substances in articles



When does the SCIP notification duty apply?



→ Duty to supply sufficient information to allow safe use of the article (Art. 33(1) REACH)

Who needs to submit a SCIP notification?

Any supplier of articles containing above 0.1% w/w of a substance of very high concern on the Candidate List





Making information available


ECHA will publish the information, as received, on its website. The **quality of the data** remains the **responsibility** of each duty holder.



• Preparing your notification online in IUCLID Cloud


ECHA Cloud services provide a IUCLID Cloud instance for preparing SCIP notifications

• Preparing your notification in IUCLID 6 (Server & Desktop)

The SCIP notification can also be prepared 'offline' in the company's own IT infrastructure More: [IUCLID 6 website](#)

• Preparing your notification for using system-to-system submission

Companies can create SCIP notification dossiers according to the harmonised format and submit them to the ECHA Submission Portal, using the system-to-system service



Simplifying the submission process

- Third parties can submit data on your company's behalf, based on intra-party arrangements ('**foreign user**' concept)
- Defining how to **refer to** data submitted by a supplier
 - **Simplified SCIP notification:** if an article is not changed, the duty holder can benefit from a simplified notification referring to the data submitted by his supplier, without preparing a dossier (e.g. useful for distributors)
 - **Referencing:** if an article (already notified by a supplier) is incorporated into a complex object, the duty holder can refer to the submitted data without re-entering it

- 2** Know and understand the information requirements
- 3** Know your portfolio of articles
- 4** Adapt your data
- 5** Prepare your submission
- 6** Submit your notification
